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NORTHPARK CENTER

Art meets fashion at **NorthPark Center**, where works by some of the world's most renown artists mingle with storefronts that range from splurge-worthy to budget-friendly. **Neiman Marcus** sets the Texas standard in luxury goods, along with its contemporary collection at *CUSP by Neiman Marcus*. **Nordstrom**, complete with *The Wedding Suite*, **Macy's** and **Dillard's** round out the center's anchors.

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When we said "splurge-worthy," we weren't kidding. The corridors of NorthPark read like the pages of *Vogue* or the labels inside your favorite celebrity's closet. From **Valentino**, to **Gucci**, to **Versace**, to **Bottega Veneta**, to **Louis Vuitton**, there's no shortage of luxury.

But NorthPark isn't one-note. There are plenty of more budget-friendly—but no less stylish—storefronts to peruse, like **Kate Spade, J.Crew, Madewell** and **H&M.** Look for **Longchamp, Zara** and **Sam Edelman** to join the NorthPark lineup in 2016.



KNOX/HENDERSON

L.A. has Melrose and Robertson. Dallas has **Knox/Henderson**, where some of the city's most note-worthy fashion boutiques and home furnishings stores reside. On Henderson Ave., start at **The Gypsy Wagon**, where boho looks that skew a little western mingle with cowboy boots and equally Texas-worthy home accessories. Walking into the first Texas location of **Planet Blue** is like entering a high-fashion version of California's Coachella music festival. (Read: high-fashion bohemian at its best.)

Also on Henderson, **Coco & Dash** is a favorite among local interior designers with its luxury home furnishings that blend antiques with new and contemporary. Further down Henderson is **Milk & Honey**, known for regularly taking the paychecks of Dallas' young and fashionable crowd. Expect everything from soft, slouchy basics to boho daywear to sleek looks perfect for a night on the town.

Across Central Expwy. on Knox St., **Planet Bardot** has a devoted following for its curated collection from internationallyacclaimed and emerging designers. **Kate Spade** and **Steven Alan** round out Knox St.'s fashion offerings, while favorites like **Crate & Barrel, Restoration Hardware, Pottery Barn** and **Mecox** are a hub for home décor enthusiasts.



If your day takes you to Knox Street, it's worth heading south on McKinney Ave. to check out more of Dallas' premier shopping spots. **Forty Five Ten** is a fashionista's dream, with the season's most note-worthy runway looks from names like *Balenciaga* and *Givenchy*. If high-design home décor is more your style, don't miss **BoConcept**, **Mitchell Gold + Bob Williams**, Design Within Reach and Jonathan Adler.

Four blocks west on Travis St., **Grange Hall** is known for home accessories, jewelry and art with a mysterious, gothic edge, while the leather goods and art at **STAG Provisions for Men** are worth a look even if you're not shopping for a man—seriously, they're that good.

ANTIQUES ON RIVERFRONT: What's old is new along Dallas' Riverfront Boulevard, where a collection of antique stores are home to everything from 19th century fine European antiques to mid-century modern treasures to century-old imports from across the globe.

BLUE PRINT: A visit to Blue Print is a real treat. The design team behind the store curates a collection that beautifully blends hand-picked antiques with modern touches in a home on Fairmount Street.

FORTY FIVE TEN: Named for its achingly chic address along uptown Dallas' McKinney Avenue, Forty Five Ten is where the who's-who of Dallas and Hollywood alike shop for the latest straight-off-the-runway styles from names like *Céline, Givenchy, Lanvin* and more.

GRANGE HALL: This Travis Street outpost is unlike any other boutique in Dallas. Its curated collection of decorative objects, coffee table books and jewelry has a gothic edge—think skulls, claws and crosses.

HIGHLAND PARK VILLAGE: The lineup of shops at Highland Park Village is a lesson in fashion history. Home to storied names like Hermès, Chanel and Saint Laurent, the open-air 1931 Mediterranean-Spanish style shopping center is a true Dallas original. KNOX-HENDERSON: Unique local boutiques stand alongside established names in this popular shopping area. Divided by Central Expressway, Henderson Ave. to the east is home to a mix of antique and import shops and trendy fashion. Knox St. to the west is known for Crate & Barrel, lululemon and Kate Spade.

LION + WITCH: The name is a clever take on C.S. Lewis' *The Lion, the Witch & the Wardrobe,* and what's inside is a fashionista's dream: a mix of east and west coast style at shockingly affordable prices. This newcomer to the Dallas shopping scene is the upscale sister store to Henderson Ave.'s Milk & Honey.

LOVER'S LANE: When Dallas' well-heeled Park Cities crowd needs a shopping fix, they head to a stretch of Lover's Lane known for its boutiques ranging from wallet-friendly fashion to upscale home furnishings and gifts. Favorites include Elements, Bel Air Home and Wisteria.

MELISSA BENGE COLLECTION: Texas-bred Melissa Benge, known for Gunslinger in Bandera, brings her brand of upscale apparel, accessories and home décor with a cowgirl flair to Henderson Ave.

MILK & HONEY: This Henderson Ave. favorite serves up just about everything a fashionista needs to build her wardrobe from soft, slouchy basics to boho daywear, to sharp, sleek styles perfect for a night out—all priced well under \$100.

NEIMAN MARCUS: No trip to Dallas is complete without a visit to Neiman Marcus at NorthPark Center, the original way to shop luxury goods in Texas.

NICOLE KWON CONCEPT STORE: Fashion editors across Dallas are buzzing about the Nicole Kwon Concept Store at West Village, which serves up a shopping experience reminiscent of New York's SoHo, filled with styles from A.L.C., Rachel Comey and Karen Walker.

NORTHPARK CENTER: Public art mingles with a lineup of stores ranging from splurge-worthy—Neiman Marcus, Gucci and Valentino, to name a few—to familiar faces like Nordstrom, H&M, Kate Spade and J.Crew. **STANLEY KORSHAK:** Known for catering to the crème de la crème, this department store located at Hotel Crescent Court has head-to-toe designer offerings from established and up-and-coming names.

THE GYPSY WAGON: The Gypsy Wagon embodies the vibe that most people would picture for a Texas boutique: casual boho styles with a western streak, alongside cowboy boots and home accessories that'll have you saying "y'all" in no time.

THE SHOPS AT PARK LANE: Located at the most-shopped intersection in Dallas, this development is home to the trifecta of Nordstrom Rack, Saks Fifth Avenue OFF 5th and Bloomingdale's The Outlet, plus the world's first J.Crew Mercantile and Forever 21's newest concept, F21 RED.
