

Govest! Only this time, go in pursuit of a different kind of liquid asset—wine. We're willing to bet you had no idea that a whopping 90% of the state's wine grapes are grown in Lubbock and the Texas South Plains. That means that regardless of where you purchase or sip your Texas wine, it's highly likely that it originated on vines in West Texas.

Vintners in Lubbock have long set the standard for Texas winemaking, and they were among the first to start experimenting with new grapes such as the now ubiquitous Texas tempranillo, sangiovese and viognier. Six award-winning wineries are uncorking these "exotic" varietals in Lubbock, many of which have been honing their skills for decades.

There's a lot more to Lubbock than wine, so plan to experience a Texas Tech Red Raiders football game, the Buddy Holly Center, the West Texas Hall of Fame and the National Ranching Heritage Center. And be sure to spend at least one evening in the revitalized Depot District, known for local hotspots and live music.

4 MCPHERSON CELLARS


